NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for approval of the preliminary plat of Prairie Lake Subdivision, a two lot, five outlot subdivision located in the Agricultural and Conservation Zoned Districts and the Shoreland Overlay District of Madison Lake and located in the southwest, southeast, northwest

and southwest quarters of the southwest quarter of Section 11, Le Ray Township (T-108-N, R-25-W) is **granted** with the following conditions:

1. Wetland delineation must be completed prior to Final Plat review and delineated boundaries displayed on the Final Plat.
2. Preliminary grading plans must be submitted prior to Final Plat review as needed.
3. Final grading plans must be submitted with Final Plat.
4. The Drainage Report must be amended and reviewed prior to Final Plat review to address the following:
 - a) Consideration should be given to using a less-complicated, more natural stormwater system using surface drainage, vegetation and infiltration rather than buried pipes and manmade materials to avoid using linear projects in the permanent stormwater system.
 - b) A description of the “underdrain” system explaining how it complies with the requirements of the NPDES permit’s Permanent Stormwater Management System to treat and infiltrate water before it leaves the site or discharged to impaired surface water and how it complies with County ordinances limiting post-development runoff to pre-development rates and volume.
 - c) A description and map of impervious surface locations on each lot, amount and flow calculations for each proposed watershed and each drainage easement, how pre- and post- development runoff will not increase, and how erosion will be controlled. Impervious surfaces should include a minimum of 12,000 square feet on each lot in the area where impervious surfaces are likely to be constructed near the lake and bluff setback lines.
 - d) Location of subsurface tile and tile outlets to ensure all tile discharges are accounted for in the drainage review and final Drainage Report so potential drainage problems are avoided and water rights are protected for current and future land uses.
5. Final improvement plans for proposed roads, drainage and erosion control structures must be submitted prior to Final Plat review.
6. Property owner must submit a long term maintenance plan for permanent stormwater system and indicate who will be responsible for long term maintenance.
7. The Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan and Permanent Stormwater System required for the NPDES permit must be submitted for review with the Final Plat.
8. Required amendments to the preliminary plat shall be submitted for review with the submittal of a final plat application.

Whereas, Chuck Brandel, I & S Group, was appointed engineer on the project to implement the project as set forth in the Petition; and

Whereas, a Final Engineer's Report was submitted by Chuck Brandel that incorporated the use of separable maintenance for those areas that needed repair and were now being improved; and

Whereas, pursuant to proper notice, a final hearing was held on April 23, 2013 at 10:15 a.m. before the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, acting as Drainage Authority for Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch 38; and

Whereas, Craig Austinson, Ditch Manager, presented evidence concerning the fact that legal notices had been sent and the necessary jurisdictional documents had been filed; and

Whereas, Leo Getsfried, DNR, gave the DNR advisory Report; and

Whereas, Chuck Brandel presented the Engineer's Report that is on file as the Final Engineer's Report and described the project along with the funding that includes assessments, Separable Maintenance and payments from MN Dot to move the main tile out from under Highway 30; and

Whereas, Ron Ringquist, appointed ditch viewers, presented the Viewers' Report, attached as Exhibit A, for the improvement of Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch 38. The report included estimated assessments to benefited property owners and estimated the separable maintenance costs so as to better describe the estimated assessments to affected landowners; and

Whereas, Public comment was solicited; and

Whereas, the general consensus of the public comment, staff reports, Engineer's and Viewers' supported the Improvement to Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch 38; and

Whereas, The Blue Earth County Commissioners, as Drainage Authority for Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch 38, makes the following Findings of Fact and Order:

1. That the detailed survey report and viewers' report, as attached as Exhibit A, have been made and other proceedings have been completed under chapter 103E.
2. The reports made or amended are complete and correct.
3. The damages and benefits have been properly determined.
4. The estimated benefits are greater than the total estimated cost, including damages.
5. The proposed drainage project will be of public utility and benefit, and will promote the public health.
6. The proposed drainage project is practicable.

NOW THEREFORE, The Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, as Drainage Authority for Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch 38, hereby adopts and confirms the Viewers' Report,

attached as Exhibit A, and establishes the proposed Improvement to Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch 38 as reported and set forth in the Final Engineer's Report and Viewers' Report.

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Drainage Authority, by motion, ordered a Redetermination of Benefits for Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch No. 38 in that the benefits do not reflect present day land values and the benefited area has changed; and

WHEREAS, three viewers were appointed to complete the Redetermination of Benefits; and

WHEREAS, proper notice of a Public Hearing on the Redetermination of Benefits was provided, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 103E.325; and

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 103E.335, was held on April 23, 2013; and

WHEREAS, public comment on the Redetermination of Benefits was heard by the Drainage Authority;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 103E.351, the Redetermined benefits and damages, as reflected in the Final Viewers Report attached to this order as Exhibit A, shall replace all benefits and damages determined under any previously accepted proceeding for the establishment, repair, improvement or use of the drainage system as an outlet for Blue Earth County Judicial Ditch No. 38.

**RESOLUTION RELATING TO
FINANCING OF CERTAIN PROPOSED PROJECTS TO BE UNDERTAKEN
BY THE COUNTY; ESTABLISHING COMPLIANCE WITH REIMBURSEMENT
BOND REGULATIONS UNDER THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE**

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) of Blue Earth County, Minnesota (the “County”), as follows:

1. Recitals.

- (a) The Internal Revenue Service has issued Section 1.150-2 of the Income Tax Regulations (the “Regulations”) dealing with the issuance of bonds, all or a portion of the proceeds of which are to be used to reimburse the County for project expenditures made by the County prior to the date of issuance.
- (b) The Regulations generally require that the County make a declaration of its official intent to reimburse itself for such prior expenditures out of the proceeds of a subsequently issued series of bonds within 60 days after payment of the expenditures, that the bonds be issued and the reimbursement allocation be made from the proceeds of such bonds within the reimbursement period (as defined in the Regulations), and that the expenditures reimbursed be capital expenditures or costs of issuance of the bonds.
- (c) The County desires to comply with requirements of the Regulations with respect to certain projects hereinafter identified.

2. Official Intent Declaration.

- (a) The County proposes to undertake the following project or projects and to make original expenditures with respect thereto prior to the issuance of reimbursement bonds, and reasonably expects to issue reimbursement bonds for such project or projects in the maximum principal amounts shown below:

<u>Project</u>	<u>Maximum Amount of Bonds Expected to be Issued for Project</u>
JD 38 improvement	\$250,000.00

- (b) Other than (i) de minimis amounts permitted to be reimbursed pursuant to Section 1.150-2(f)(1) of the Regulations or (ii) expenditures constituting preliminary expenditures as defined in Section 1.150-2(f)(2) of the Regulations, the County will not seek reimbursement for any original expenditures with respect to the foregoing projects paid more than 60 days prior to the date of adoption of this resolution. All original expenditures for which

reimbursement is sought will be capital expenditures or costs of issuance of the reimbursement bonds.

3. Budgetary Matters.

As of the date hereof, there are no County funds reserved, pledged, allocated on a long term basis or otherwise set aside (or reasonably expected to be reserved, pledged, allocated on a long term basis or otherwise set aside) to provide permanent financing for the original expenditures related to the projects, other than pursuant to the issuance of the reimbursement bonds. Consequently, it is not expected that the issuance of the reimbursement bonds will result in the creation of any replacement proceeds.

4. Reimbursement Allocations.

The County's Financial officer shall be responsible for making the "reimbursement allocations" described in the Regulations, being generally the transfer of the appropriate amount of proceeds of the reimbursement bonds to reimburse the source of temporary financing used by the County to make payment of the original expenditures relating to the projects. Each reimbursement allocation shall be made within 30 days of the date of issuance of the reimbursement bonds, shall be evidenced by an entry on the official books and records of the county maintained for the reimbursement bonds and shall specifically identify the original expenditures being reimbursed.

Cottonwood is the new owner of what was previously known as Sunrise Cottages. The term of the contract is April 1, 2013, through September 30, 2014.

Alliance Health Care

A contract with Alliance Health Care to provide Employer of Record Services for Specified Employees. The term of the contract is from May 1, 2013, through April 30, 2014.
