Mr. George Leary, Land Use Administrator, and Ms. Sara Isebrand, Land Use Specialist, presented the following items to the Board.

Commissioner Purvis moved and Commissioner Piepho seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

**RESOLUTION GRANTING APPROVAL OF THE PRELIMINARY AND FINAL PLATS OF NATURE POND, A ONE LOT AND ONE OUTLOT SUBDIVISION LOCATED IN THE AGRICULTURAL AND SHORELAND ZONED DISTRICTS IN THAT PART OF GOVERNMENT LOT 4 LYING WITHIN THE NE ¼ OF THE NW ¼, AND THE SE ¼ OF THE NW ¼ OF SECTION 29, JAMESTOWN TOWNSHIP (T-109-N, R-25-W).**

**WHEREAS**, Crescentia A. Reid, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

As defined on the Plat of Nature Pond;

is requesting approval of Nature Pond, a plat creating a 2.92 acre residential parcel and a 16.01 acre outlot located in Agricultural and Shoreland Zoning Districts; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 19-11), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

**WHEREAS**; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th day of September 2011, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 19-11 and,

**WHEREAS**; the County Board on the 20th day of September 2011, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions included in staff report PC 19-11, and,

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the county land use plan.
2. The demonstrated need for the proposed use.
3. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the county.

4. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
5. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
6. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
7. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
8. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.
9. That facilities are provided to eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.
10. That the subdivision proposal will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
11. That the establishment of the subdivision will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.
12. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.
13. That the density of proposed residential development is not greater than the density of the surrounding neighborhood or not greater than the density indicated by the applicable zoning district.
14. That site specific conditions and such other conditions are established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals and general welfare.
15. That the intensity of the proposed residential development is not greater than the intensity allowed in the Agricultural Zoning District. Section 24-111 of the Agricultural District States: "Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agricultural zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agricultural zone may be subjected to inconvenience or discomfort arising from normal and accepted agricultural practices and operations including, but not limited to; noise, odors, dust, operation of aircraft and late night operation of farm machinery, the

storage and application of manure, fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides, and pesticides associated with normal agricultural operations.”

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for approval of the preliminary and final plat of Nature Pond, a one lot and one outlot subdivision located in the Agricultural and Shoreland Zoned District in the NE ¼ of the NW ¼ and the SE ¼ of the NW ¼ of Section 29, Jamestown Township (T-109-N, R-25-W) is **granted** with the following conditions:

1. The developer of the residential parcel acknowledges and understands the following cautionary disclosure from the Blue Earth County Code of Ordinances, Division 2. Agricultural District, Section 24-111 Purpose, Subpart (b) Agricultural operations. Said disclosure states:

Through the adoption of this subsection, the board of commissioners is expressing its intent to enhance and encourage agricultural operations within the boundaries of the county. The county will view the agriculture district as a zone in which land is used for commercial agricultural production. Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agriculture zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agriculture zone may be subjected to inconvenience or discomfort arising from normal and accepted agricultural practices and operations including, but not limited to; noise, odors, dust, operation of aircraft and late night operation of farm machinery, the storage and application of manure, fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides and pesticides associated with normal agricultural operations. Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agriculture zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agriculture zone, should be prepared to accept such inconveniences or discomfort from normal operations, and are hereby put on official notice, pursuant to Minn. Stats. ch. 561.19, that this declaration may prevent them from obtaining a legal judgment against such normal operations.

2. The final plat of Nature Pond must be recorded within one year of approval by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners.

3. No burning or burial of the old home or buildings. If in conjunction with a controlled practice burn by the area serving fire department, burning of the house may be allowed.

4. The proposed upgrade of the septic system serving the existing building site must be installed by July 22, 2013.

This subdivision plat shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

**WHEREAS**, Denise Cumming, owner and Lime Land Industries LLC, CFD buyer, of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of the NE ¼ of Section 24, Township 105, Range 26; thence proceeding North on the West quarter-section line of said NE ¼ to the Southerly boundary of the former right-of-way of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad Co.; thence proceeding in a Southerly and Easterly direction along the Southerly edge of said former right-of-way to a point where said Southerly edge intersects with the South quarter-section line of said NE ¼; thence West on the quarter-section line to the place of beginning.

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 20-11), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

**WHEREAS**; the request to place and store agricultural lime does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, through approval of a Conditional Use Permit authorized by the Blue Earth County board of Commissioners; and,

**WHEREAS**; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th Day of September 2011, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report PC 20-11 and,

**WHEREAS**; the County Board on the 20<sup>th</sup> Day of September 2010, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions included in staff report PC 20-11 and,

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the county land use plan.

2. The demonstrated need for the proposed use.
3. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the county.
4. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
5. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
6. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
7. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the Conditional Use Permit is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. That adequate silt fence or comparable erosion control measures be installed on the back side of the proposed berm as outlined on the attached site plan.

2. That all erosion control measures shall be maintained throughout the process and until an adequate vegetative cover can be established. This will include, but is not limited to, the removal of silt as needed and repairing any washouts that form in the slopes.
3. That following the final grading and abandonment of the site all exposed areas will be immediately seeded into an appropriate seed mix or converted back into crop land.
4. That if needed, an MPCA Storm Water Permit be obtained prior to exceeding one acre of disturbed soil.
5. That prior to stockpiling and storing lime from a water treatment plant or similar operation, the applicant shall bring the proposal back before the Planning Commission and County Board for further review.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

**WHEREAS**, John Ward, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

That part of the West Half of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 5; Township 106 North, Range 25 West Blue Earth County Minnesota except the following two tracts:

That part of the West Half of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 5; Township 106 North, Range 25 West, Blue earth County, Minnesota, described as:

Beginning at the West Quarter corner of Section 5; thence North 00 degrees 04 minutes 07 seconds East (assumed bearing), along the west line of the Northwest Quarter of Section 5 a distance of 315.19 feet; thence South 89 degrees 23 minutes 50 seconds East, 659.75 feet to a

LOCATED IN SOUTH BEND, LOTS 10 AND 11, BLOCK 1, WORTHLEY'S  
SUBDIVISION, SOUTH BEND TOWNSHIP, AND ZONED LIGHT INDUSTRIAL. (T-  
108-N, R-27-W)**

**WHEREAS**, Triple K Partnership of Mankato LLP, owner of the following real estate, and Nate Lundgren, operator, in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

The Easterly 112 feet of Lot 10, Lot 11, the East Half (E ½) of the vacated alley abutting on Lot Eleven (11) and the West Half (W ½) of the vacated alley abutting on Lot One (1), Worthley's Subdivision of a part of Section 23, Township 108, Range 27 West, according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Blue Earth County, Minnesota.

Subject to the following exceptions on Lot 11:

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for an after-the-fact conditional use permit to operate an auto body repair shop located in South Bend lots 10 and 11, block 1, Worthley's Subdivision, South Bend Township, and zoned Light Industrial. (T-108-N, R-27-W) is **granted** with the following conditions:

1. All activities shall be done in conformance with all applicable federal, state and county rules.
2. All spills shall be reported to the state duty officer, the MPCA and Blue Earth County Immediately.
3. Blue Earth County may be allowed onsite to inspect the business once a year as needed.
4. The site is prohibited from becoming a junkyard as defined by the Blue Earth County Code of Ordinances.
5. Hours of operation will consist of Monday –Friday 8 am to 5 pm and Saturday 8 am to 12 pm.
6. All automotive wastes must be disposed of in conformance with all applicable federal, state and county rules.
7. Vehicles shall be limited to 10 customer cars and five employee cars at any given time at the site.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES**

Mr. Scott Fichtner, Environmental Services Director, presented information regarding a water management fee to the Board.

Commissioner Campbell moved and Commissioner Stuehrenberg seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

### **RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A WATER MANAGEMENT FEE FOR BLUE EARTH COUNTY**

WHEREAS, Water management programs protecting surface water and groundwater benefit all residents as they protect public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County places a high priority on the protection of its natural resources as a benefit for all citizens; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute 103B.311 encourages each county to develop and implement a local water management plan; and

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County has had a water management plan, approved by the State of Minnesota since 1990; and

WHEREAS, water management plan activities are essential in the protection of ground and surface waters of Blue Earth County; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute 103B.331, subdivision 3, clause 3 states that a county “can charge users for services provided by the county necessary to implement the local water management plan”.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners establishes a Water Management Fee to implement activities in the local water management plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Water Management Fee will be collected as charges billed on the Blue Earth County tax statements in combination with the current Recycling Fee. The amounts will be determined by the rate schedule established by the Board of Commissioners.

**RESOLUTION TO SET THE RECYCLING/WATER MANAGEMENT FEE RATES**

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County provides solid waste and water management services for the protection of the environment for the citizens of the County; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes 400.08 allows counties to collect a fee for solid waste services provided by the county, or by others under contract with the county; and

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County has collected a Recycling Fee for waste management programs that benefit all county citizens as a separate line item on the tax statements since 1991; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute 103B.331, subdivision 3, clause 3 states that a county can charge users for services provided by the county necessary to implement the local water management plan; and

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County has established a Water Management Fee to implement activities in the local water management plan.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the following rates and charges for the Blue Earth County Recycling/Water Management Fee for solid waste and water management services are hereby certified to the Blue Earth County Administrator for collection as part of the 2012 and subsequent years property tax statements:

Home and Community Based Services

These 31 contracts provide home and community based services for the Medical Assistance Waivered Programs in Blue Earth County. These contracts cover waived care services for
