ORDINANCE GRANTING APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE BLUE EARTH COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES TO BE

FOLLOWED BY THE CITY, COUNTY, AND TOWNSHIPS WHEN REVIEWING AND PROCESSING ZONING REQUESTS WHERE AN ORDERLY ANNEXATION AGREEMENT IS IN PLACE.

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County Citizens, the County Board, the City of Mankato, and townships surrounding the City of Mankato have seen a need to strictly regulate residential development in the rural unincorporated areas. The Urban Fringe Overlay District (UFD) was drafted as a joint effort of the planning departments of the City of Mankato and Blue Earth County staff during the fall and winter of 1997. The UFD was adopted by the Blue Earth County Board on March 24, 1998; and,

WHEREAS, Section 24-501, Purpose of the UFD states:

(a) The purpose of this UFD urban fringe overlay district is to prevent encroachment of non-farm uses into agricultural lands, and to allow for the orderly conversion of agricultural lands to urban types which are serviced by municipal water and sewer systems. Some of the non-farm uses with the underlying districts are not compatible with, and/or may interfere with, the orderly development of this area for future urban uses if allowed to develop without the limitations imposed by this urban fringe overlay district. Limiting the intensity of development within the UFD ensures that development occurs in a fiscally and environmentally responsible manner consistent with future development plans for the area.

(b) Land use planning within the UFD should be a cooperative effort between the County and Municipality in order to work toward the most efficient, planned and cost-effective delivery of government services. Planning within the UFD must also ensure compatibility of one community's development with the development of neighboring communities or jurisdictions.

(c) The UFD district standards allow for the continuation and maintenance of existing non-farm uses in the UFD, and,

WHEREAS, Blue Earth County supports orderly development agreements between the cities and the townships that surround them. There are three orderly development agreements in place between the City of Mankato and its surrounding townships; and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Planning Department is proposing an amendment to the Blue Earth County Code of Ordinances establishing procedures to be followed for review of zoning matters by the City, County, and Township when an orderly development agreement is in place; and,

WHEREAS, This amendment is necessary to ensure that citizens receive governmental approval within the parameters established by Minnesota Statutes Chapter 15.99, Time Deadline for Agency Action, commonly called the 60 day law. This statute mandates that a zoning request

(application) must be brought in front of the County Board for action within 60 days from the time that the application is accepted or the request will be granted by default. In the past staff has always sent an applicant to the Township and City for preliminary approval before an application is accepted. This is done to ensure that township/city approval processes will not interfere with the 60 day deadline. This amendment documents and memorializes past procedures utilized by the County when reviewing zoning and development requests within the UFD when orderly development agreements are in place between a city and a township; and,

WHEREAS, this proposed amendment is supported by the City of Mankato; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 48-06), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

WHEREAS; the Planning Commission of the County on the 4th day of October, 2006, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the proposed amendment, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval; and,

WHEREAS; the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners held a public hearing regarding the proposed amendment on the 17th day of October, 2006. After due consideration of presented testimony and information, the Board voted to approve the amendment as drafted; and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 394.21 to 394.37 gives counties the authority to regulate land development by adopting and amending Official Land Use Controls.
2. The purpose of this amendment to the County Code is to establish procedures to be followed for review of zoning matters by the City, County, and Township where orderly annexation agreements are in place.
3. The proposed amendment is consistent with the intent of the UFD.
4. The proposed amendment does not conflict with the Blue Earth County Land Use Plan.
5. This amendment documents and memorializes past procedures utilized by the County when reviewing zoning and development requests where orderly annexation agreements are in place.
6. This amendment is necessary to ensure that citizens receive governmental approval within the parameters established by Minnesota Statutes Chapter 15.99, Time Deadline for Agency Action, commonly called the 60 day law.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the following amendment is hereby adopted.

ARTICLE X ~ ORDERLY ANNEXATION AREAS

(Added by Amendment 10-17-06)

Sec. 24-525. Purpose

The purpose of this section is to address situations in which a township within Blue Earth County has entered into a Joint Resolution for Orderly Annexation, under Minnesota Statutes, with a statutory or home rule charter city.

Land use planning in areas subject to Orderly Annexation agreements should be a cooperative effort between the County, Township, and Municipality in order to work toward the most efficient, planned and cost-effective delivery of government services.

This section will apply to all areas of Blue Earth County that are included within a Joint Resolution for Orderly Annexation and are subject to the provisions of this Ordinance.

Sec. 24-526. Review of Zoning, Subdivisions, and Permits.

The following shall apply to all lands located within an area subject to the provisions of a Joint Resolution for Orderly Annexation:

1. Prior to the County accepting an application from any property owner, person(s) or business entity to have any parcel of land subdivided, platted, or re-zoned, or prior to accepting an application for a variance, conditional use permit, construction permit, or a land use permit for the demolition, construction, repair or improvement of a building within the Township, the proposed application must be submitted to the Township and the City for review.
2. The County must receive written authorization from both the Township and the City that the proposed application does not require annexation under the terms of the Joint Resolution for Orderly Annexation before any application can be considered complete.
3. Any application which is determined by either the Township or the City to require annexation under the terms of the Joint Resolution for Orderly Annexation must not be accepted by the County.

This Amendment shall become effective 30 days after County Board approval and after publication.

WHEREAS, an application for tax free zone designation in the County was submitted to the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development via the City of Fairmont, Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the County finds it is necessary to modify the "Blue Earth County JOBZ Subzones Application" previously submitted to the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development via the City of Fairmont, Minnesota; therefore,

**THE BLUE EARTH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
RESOLVES:**

Sec. 1. That the County Board of Commissioners, at its meeting held on October 17, 2006, upon careful consideration and review, approves the request to modify the Blue Earth County JOBZ Subzones Application as per amended application materials dated September 14, 2006 (Big Gain, Inc. project) for tax free zones, approves of the use of tax exemptions and tax credits within the designated zones (subject to proper review and approval by the other appropriate taxing authorities within the zones), and encourages the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development to approve the request to modify the Blue Earth County JOBZ Subzones Application.

Sec. 2. That the County agrees to provide all of the local tax exemptions and credits required and provided for under the JOBZ's Legislation and agrees to forego the tax benefits resulting from the local and state tax exemptions and credits provided under the JOBZ's Legislation.

WHEREAS, the County has received a proposal to grant JOBZ Business Subsidies from Big Gain, Inc. (the "Qualified Business") within the Subzone under the provisions of the Business Subsidy Statute; and

WHEREAS, the County has drafted a Subsidy Agreement under the provisions of the Business Subsidy Statute; and

WHEREAS, the County on October 17, 2006, after having published notice of public hearing in the official newspaper, conducted a public hearing on the JOBZ Business Subsidies and received public comments on the same; now therefore

**THE BLUE EARTH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
RESOLVES:**

Sec. 1. That the Qualified Business will locate within the Subzone on property with tax identification number R.50.08.23.202.010 which is comprised of land with a building thereon.

Sec. 2. That the Qualified Business is approved by the County to be a business expansion in the Subzone, which is a business that maintains its current operations in its current location and is expanding its operations and its payroll within the Subzone.

Sec. 3. That the public purposes for the JOBZ Business Subsidy include enhancement of economic diversity, creation of high quality job growth, stabilization of the community and enhancement of the tax base.

Sec. 4. That the County Board authorizes the County Administrator and Board Chairperson to execute the Subsidy Agreement with the Qualified Business.

Sec. 5. That the Job Zone Term shall be effective upon execution of the Subsidy Agreement until December 31, 2015.

Sec. 6. That the County Administrator is hereby directed to file a copy of this resolution and the Subsidy Agreement with the Department Employment and Economic Development and the Blue Earth County Assessor.
