Southeast Quarter of Section 10, Township 105 North Range 27 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota. Approximate GPS coordinates: 43 54 38.65N, 94 03 12.3W, owned by Cheryl and George Langworthy;

is requesting a conditional use permit to construct and operate a 535 foot tall FM Radio Transmission Tower in the Agriculture Zoned District in the Southeast Quarter of Section 10, Sterling Township; and,

WHEREAS, Minnesota Environmental Quality Board (EQB) Rules, Section 4410.4300 subpart 33, Communication Towers, mandates an EAW for this project. An EAW is defined by State Statute to be a brief document which is designed to set out the basic facts necessary to determine whether an EIS is needed for a proposed project. The information disclosed in the EAW process is used to determine whether an EIS is needed and how the project can be modified to lessen its environmental impacts if any are found to exist. The EAW for the proposed tower was prepared by Garrett Lysniac and Michael O'Rourke of Owl Engineering and Test Labs, Inc, on the applicant's behalf.

1. That the proposed tower conforms with the County Land Use Plan.
2. That there is a demonstrated need for the proposed tower.
3. That the proposed tower will not degrade the water quality of the County.
4. That the proposed tower will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
5. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed tower.
6. That the proposed tower does not create a potential pollution hazard.
7. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been provided.
8. That adequate measures have been taken to provide sufficient off-street parking and loading space to serve the proposed tower.
9. That facilities are provided to eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed tower.
10. That the proposed tower will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
11. That the proposed tower will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.
12. That adequate measures have been taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance,

and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.

13. That the density of proposed residential development is not greater than the density of the surrounding neighborhood or not greater than the density indicated by the applicable Zoning District.
14. That the intensity of proposed commercial or industrial development is not greater than the intensity of the surrounding uses or not greater than the intensity characteristic of the Agricultural Zoning District.
15. That site specific conditions and such other conditions are established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request to construct and operate a 535 foot tall FM Radio Broadcasting Tower is hereby **granted** Contingent upon the following conditions:

1. The tower shall be setback from the roadway and property lines as per attached site plan.
2. Accessory building(s) may be allowed for each co-location user of the facility. Each building shall house only electronic equipment and environmental control equipment that is necessary for the functioning of the broadcasting tower.
3. The tower and accessory building(s) shall be adequately fenced. Gates shall be locked.
4. The tower operator shall ensure that the site is maintained in a weed free and nuisance free manner.
5. Signs, other than warning signs, equipment labels, or emergency information, are prohibited on any tower or accessory structure or equipment. Warning signs, equipment labels and emergency information signs must not exceed three square feet in area.
6. The broadcasting tower shall be a single, neutral color, unless alternative colors are required by the FAA.
7. The broadcasting tower shall meet all requirements of the FAA and FCC.
8. The tower operator shall consult with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to design the tower to minimize (to the extent possible) bird mortality from hits on the tower.

9. The parking surface and access drives shall be maintained with an all weather surface.
10. A bond or other financial assurance acceptable to Blue Earth County shall be established and kept in place to cover the cost of proper removal of all concrete foundations and fittings in the event that the tower is abandoned. The estimated cost of removal is \$30,000.00, therefore said bond shall be in the amount of \$30,000.00. Abandoned or unused towers and associated facilities shall be removed within twelve months of the cessation of operations at the site. Bond shall be delivered to Blue Earth County prior to issuance of construction permit for the tower.
11. The broadcasting tower shall be designed, structurally, electrically, and in all respects, to accommodate the applicant's antennae and comparable antennae from at least three additional users. The tower must be designed to allow for future rearrangement of antennae upon the tower and to accept antennae mounted at varying heights.
12. Applicant agrees to grant the County a first refusal right to use antennae space on the tower and equipment space within the accessory building(s). Such space to be for governmental use including, but not limited to; communications service antennae and related equipment to accommodate Cellular Telephone Service, Personal Communications Services (PCS), and Cellular Digital Packet Data (CDPD) Service, to the extent the tower can accommodate such use. If space is not available within the accessory building, the owner of the tower shall allow the County to construct additional accessory building(s) as required to house County equipment. Owner of the tower shall make the space available at the prevailing market rate.

If the County reserves space for governmental use, the County will ensure that any equipment installed by the County on the tower, or in the accessory building, will not interfere with the operation of the applicants or other tenants equipment. Correction of any interference caused by installation of County equipment shall be the County's responsibility. Interference caused by any other tenant's equipment installed after the County's equipment, shall be the responsibility of the third party.

All utility costs, and costs connected with installation and maintenance of County equipment, shall be borne by the County.

The County shall provide appropriate proof of insurance and/or release of liability to the tower owner. Such insurance and/or release of liability shall apply equally to equipment owned or controlled by the County and/or actions taken by County employees and/or agents.

13. Any change in operation or use of the facility shall require review of the conditional use permit. The applicant shall apply for a review of the conditional use permit prior to any operational or construction changes involved with the proposed use.
14. Violations of the above conditions may lead to a review of the conditional use permit by the planning commission and County Board of Commissioners.
15. The conditional use permit shall be effective for a period of five years following County Board approval, until July 24, 2012, whereupon it may be reviewed by the Board.

Time extensions for Conditional Use Permits must be obtained from the County Board of Commissioners subsequent to a public hearing conducted by the Planning Commission.

5. If required by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, that the applicant obtain a Department of Natural Resources, "Water Appropriations Permit" before any animals are placed in the proposed barn.
6. That a perimeter footing drain tile be located at or below the bottom of the pit footings. The footing tile shall include one inspection pipe for each concrete pit. The native materials must be excavated and walls back filled with granular material (pit run gravel or equivalent). *Exceptions to this may only include specific design standards submitted by the design engineer of the manure storage structure.*
7. That application of manure be on the land documented in the aerial photos included in the State of Minnesota Application for Construction and Operation of an animal feedlot. The application of manure shall comply with standards set forth by the MPCA. A manure management plan meeting MPCA requirements must be reviewed by the operator each year and adjusted for any changes in the amount of manure production, manure nutrient test results, fields available for receiving manure, crop rotations, or other practices which affect the available nutrient amounts or crop nutrient needs on fields receiving manure. Records of manure application shall be maintained as required by the MPCA. Manure application setback standards for the fields on which the manure is applied shall be followed as required by the MPCA and the County.
8. That the disposal of dead animals be consistent with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations.
9. If rendering is the method of choice for mortality disposal, the applicant shall provide an enclosed location for the pick up of dead animals before any animals are placed in the proposed barn. If the livestock mortality is kept near the immediate building(s) a containment box is not required unless required at some time by regulation changes.
10. That adequate measures be taken to minimize or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, or vibrations so that none of these will constitute a nuisance.
11. That the manure storage structure be designed by a registered engineer. A copy of the designed plans must be submitted to Blue Earth County Environmental Services prior to the issuance of a construction permit.
12. That the applicant will furnish a final construction report to Environmental Services verifying that the concrete manure storage structure was constructed per approved engineered design plan within 60 days of completion of any new or modified manure storage area. Said construction report shall be signed by the design engineer.
13. That the applicant comply with the storm-water control requirements established by the MPCA.
14. That all exposed earthen surfaces be seeded into grass or utilized as crop acreage.

Commissioner Landkamer moved and Commissioner Purvis seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION GRANTING A REQUEST FOR A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO ESTABLISH A MINERAL EXTRACTION OPERATION FOR THE MINING, PROCESSING, CRUSHING, AND STOCKPILING OF SAND AND GRAVEL. THE SITE WILL ALSO INCLUDE A PORTABLE CONCRETE BATCH PLANT. THE SITE IS LOCATED IN GOVERNMENT LOT 9 AND PART OF GOVERNMENT LOT 8 OF SECTION 29, SOUTH BEND TOWNSHIP.

WHEREAS, Southern Minnesota Construction Company, Inc, owner of the gravel mining operation in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

That certain tract of land within Section 29, Township 108, Range 27, consisting of all of Government Lot 9 and that part of Government Lot 8 lying West of the North-South centerline of said Section, Blue Earth County, Minnesota.

Is requesting the establishment of a Conditional Use Permit to commence gravel mining activities and associated processing activities: and,

WHEREAS, the planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 30-07), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

WHEREAS, the requested use does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, Gravel Mining Operations are a Conditional Use in the Conservation and Shoreland Zoned Districts; and,

WHEREAS, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. The establishment of the use conforms with the Land Use Plan.
2. That with proper management, the use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That with proper management, the use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the use.
5. That the establishment does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been provided.
7. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. The establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominant uses in the area.
9. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to prevent or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, and vibration, so that none of these will constitute a nuisance, and to control lighted signs and other lights in such a manner that no disturbance to neighboring properties will result.
10. The intensity of the use is not greater than the intensity of the surrounding land uses.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit is hereby granted based on the following conditions:

Recommendations

Staff recommends **approval** contingent upon the following conditions:

1. The mining operation shall be conducted in compliance with the laws of the State of Minnesota, the Federal Government, and the Blue Earth County Zoning Ordinance, Article 7 Mineral Extraction, as set forth in, and in compliance with the submitted reclamation plan.
2. The applicant shall obtain and maintain all air emissions and water quality permits as required by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.
3. Hours of operation shall be limited to 7:00 AM through 9:00 PM to prevent disturbing noise during normal sleeping hours. A quiet-time start-up period may commence at 6:00 AM.
4. Access points from and onto any road or highway shall be clearly indicated, and only those access points shall be utilized. All access points must be approved by the appropriate jurisdictional agency.
5. Trucks used in hauling materials from the site of excavation shall be loaded in such a manner as to minimize spillage onto public roadways. Precautions must be taken to minimize the deposit of dirt and mined materials onto public roads or highways. Any spillage resulting from overloading or from adhering to truck tires shall be removed at regular intervals.
6. The amount of overburden to be removed shall not be in excess of that required to undertake operations in an economical manner. Development toward the final reclamation plan shall be carried on as excavation progresses.
7. Proposed back slopes, graded or back filled areas, or banks shall conform to the approved reclamation plan and shall be covered with sufficient topsoil to provide for re-vegetation. Where ground cover or other planting is indicated on an approved plan, such planting shall be made in areas where excavation is completed and land is not being used for material storage, and shall be as recommended by the SWCD.

8. Upon completion of excavation, all buildings, plants, and equipment, shall be removed within six (6) months, unless such buildings, plants, and equipment will be used in the reclamation process.
9. Operating procedures will be utilized to control dust and noise so as not to be in conflict with adjoining property owners.
10. Mining operations shall not be conducted closer than fifty (50) feet to the boundary of an adjoining property line, unless the written consent of the adjoining property owner is first secured.
11. Excavating or stockpiling shall not be conducted closer than one hundred (100) feet to the right-of-way line of any existing or platted street, road, or highway, where such excavation may create a traffic or line of site problem.
12. Excavating or stockpiling may not occur within 100 feet of the OHWM of the Blue Earth River.
13. A Reclamation Performance Bond or Letter of Credit for \$1,000 per acre shall be presented to the County and maintained until closure to guarantee that either upon termination of the permit or the operations, the ground surface of the land used shall be restored in conformity with the reclamation plan filed with the mining permit application.
14. Violations of any of the above conditions may lead to a review of this conditional use permit by the County Board. Actions taken by the Board may be civil or criminal in nature and may include suspension or revocation of this permit.
15. This permit shall be effective for a period of five years, until July 24, 2012, after which it will be reviewed by the Blue Earth County Board. Board action may include continuation, modification, or revocation with cause.
16. The applicant shall enter into a road maintenance agreement with South Bend Township prior to commencement of mining activities.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.
