BLUE EARTH COUNTY, MINNESOTA**

**September 27, 2005**

The County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioners' Room at 9:00 AM.

Present were Chairperson Tom McLaughlin, Commissioners Kip Bruender, Colleen Landkamer, Bob Roberts, and Katy Wortel. Also present were County Administrator Dennis McCoy and County Attorney Ross Arneson.

**AMENDED AGENDA**

Commissioner Landkamer moved and Commissioner Bruender seconded the motion to approve the amended agenda to defer the Human Services agenda to the October 4, 2005 Board Meeting and authorize a letter to the Federal delegation regarding pending Federal methamphetamine legislation. All present said the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

The Commissioners reported on the committees they attended since the last Board Meeting.

**PLANNING AND ZONING**

Mr. Veryl Morrell, Land Use Administrator, and Mr. Scott Salsbury, Land Use Planner, presented the following items to the Board.

Commissioner Bruender moved and Commissioner Roberts seconded the motion to approve the following resolution:

**RESOLUTION GRANTING A  
CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT  
TO TRANSFER A DEVELOPMENT RIGHT  
FROM THE SW 1/4 OF THE NW 1/4  
TO THE SE 1/4 OF THE NW 1/4  
SECTION 29, LERAY TOWNSHIP**

**WHEREAS**, Lloyd L Wilkinson, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

The South Half of the Northwest Quarter of Section 4, Section 29 Township 108 North Range 25 West, Blue Earth County;

And Mary and James Bauer have applied for a Conditional Use Permit to Transfer a Residential Development Right from the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter to the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 29, LeRay Township for the purpose of having two building sites in a quarter-quarter section.

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 32-05 ), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission of the County on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2005, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the Transfer of the Development Right conforms with the County Land Use Plan.
2. That the Transfer of the Development Right will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That the Transfer of the Development Right will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.

4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the Transfer of the Development Right.
5. That the Transfer of the Development Right does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
7. That the Transfer of the Development Right will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That the establishment of the Transfer of the Development Right will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.
9. That site specific conditions and such other conditions are established as required for the protection of the public's health, safety, morals, and general welfare.
10. That the intensity of the proposed residential development is not greater than the intensity allowed in the Agricultural Zoning District.
11. Sec. 24-111 of the Agricultural District States : "Owners of property, residents, other users of property in the agricultural zone, and neighboring properties adjacent to the agricultural zone may be subjected to inconvenience or discomfort arising from normal and accepted agricultural practices and operations including, but not limited to; noise, odors, dust, operation of aircraft and late night operation of farm machinery, the storage and application of manure, fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides, and pesticides associated with normal agricultural operations.

Owners of Property, residents, other users of property in the agricultural zone, and neighboring properties to the agricultural zone, should be prepared to accept such inconveniences or discomfort from normal operations, and are hereby put on official notice, pursuant to MN Statutes, Chapter 561.19, that this declaration may prevent them from obtaining a legal judgment against such normal operations."

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the Conditional Use Permit to Transfer a Residential Development Right from the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter to the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 29, LeRay Township for the purpose of having two building sites in a quarter-quarter section is granted with the following conditions:

1. The applicant divide the property in accordance with the provisions of the County Code.
2. That if the applicants propose to construct their dwelling in an area that is currently shown as Floodplain on the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map, a Letter of Map Amendment showing that the proposed building site is outside the Floodplain must be issued by FEMA before a construction permit granted.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

**WHEREAS**, Michael Hagen and Amy L.Hagen, and Lloyd L. Thrun, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

The Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 8, Decoria Township, T107 North, Range 26 West, Blue Earth County, Minnesota,

are requesting a Conditional Use Permit to transfer the Development Right from the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 Section 8, Decoria Township to the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4, Section 8, Decoria Township, to permit construction of a second dwelling in the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of said Section 8, Decoria Township; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 33-05), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

**WHEREAS**; the request to transfer development rights does not conflict with the Land Use Plan, up to four homes are permitted in any individual 1/4-1/4 section in the Agricultural and Conservation Zoned Districts through approval of a Conditional Use Permit authorizing transfer of developments by the Blue Earth County board of Commissioners; and,

**WHEREAS**; the Planning Commission of the County on the 7<sup>th</sup> Day of September, 2005, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due

consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report No. PC 33-05, and,

**WHEREAS;** the County Board on the 27<sup>th</sup> Day of September, 2005, held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to approve the request subject to conditions included in staff report No. PC 33-05, and,

**WHEREAS,** the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the County Land Use Plan.
2. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
5. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
7. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That the establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.
9. That the density of proposed residential development is not greater than the density of the surrounding neighborhood or the density indicated by the applicable Zoning District.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the Conditional Use Permit is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. That the land be subdivided pursuant to the Blue Earth County Subdivision Ordinance.
2. That construction permits and septic permits be obtained prior to the commencement of construction.

This Conditional Use Permit shall become effective immediately upon it's passage and without publication.

**RESOLUTION GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT ONE TOTAL CONFINEMENT SWINE BARN AT AN EXISTING FEEDLOT. THE EXPANSION WILL INCREASE THE NUMBER OF ANIMAL UNITS FROM 279 TO 419 ANIMAL UNITS. THE FEEDLOT IS LOCATED IN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 9, VERNON CENTER TOWNSHIP.**

**WHEREAS**, Henry Roelofs, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

Commencing at the Northeast corner of the Southeast Quarter (SE1/4) of Section 9, Township 106, Range 28, thence South 795' to the point of beginning; thence continuing South on the North/South section line to the point of intersection with the center thread of County Ditch #78; thence westerly and northerly along the center thread of County Ditch No. 78 to a point due West of the point of beginning; thence East to the point of beginning.

has applied for a Conditional Use Permit to construct one total confinement swine barn at an existing feedlot in an A, Agriculture Zoning District; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC35-05), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th day of September, 2005, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds that:

1. That with proper management of the proposed barn and with proper manure application, the Conditional Use should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity designated for agricultural uses.

2. That with proper management of the proposed barn and with proper manure application, this facility should not constitute a pollution problem.
3. That the predominant use in the area is agriculture. The Conditional Use should not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for agricultural uses.
4. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or will be provided.
5. Adequate measures will be taken to provide sufficient off-road parking and loading space to serve the proposed use.
6. Soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed request.
7. Proper facilities will be provided which will eliminate any traffic congestion or traffic hazard which may result from the proposed use.
8. The feedlot is not greater than the feedlot standards allowed in the A, Agricultural Zoning District.
9. The proposed use is consistent with the County Land Use Plan.
10. That the proposed use does not include residential development.
11. That the proposed use does not include industrial development.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit, to build one additional total confinement swine barn in an Agriculture Zoning District, is granted with the following conditions:

1. That the total confinement barn, conforms with the site plan attached to this report (PC 35-05).
2. That the feedlot, including all buildings and the proposed barn, be located on a single, legally described parcel consisting of a minimum of ten contiguous acres. The parcel shall be a parcel of record, properly recorded in the Blue Earth County Land Records Office.
3. That the applicant must obtain an updated Blue Earth County Feedlot Permit before any animals are placed in the barn.

4. That the applicant obtain a Blue Earth County Construction Permit before building begins and within one year from the date the County Board of Commissioners approves the Conditional Use Permit. The permit shall be rendered invalid if application for a Construction Permit is not made within this one year period. Time extensions for Conditional Use Permits must be obtained from the County Board of Commissioners subsequent to a public hearing conducted by the Planning Commission.
5. That a perimeter footing drain tile be located at or below the bottom of the pit footings. The footing tile shall include one inspection pipe for each concrete pit. The native materials must be excavated and walls back filled with granular material (pit run gravel or equivalent). *Exceptions to this may only include specific design standards submitted by the design engineer of the manure storage structure.*
6. That management of the manure produced from the site be in accordance with the manure management plan submitted to the MPCA. Any changes in manure management from the site shall be reflected in the manure management plan on file at the feedlot. This plan must be reviewed by the operator each year and adjusted for any changes in the amount of manure production, manure nutrient test results, fields available for receiving manure, crop rotations, or other practices which affect the available nutrient amounts or crop nutrient needs on fields receiving manure as required by the MPCA. Manure application setback standards for the fields on which the manure is applied shall be followed as provided in attachment A3.
7. That the disposal of dead animals be consistent with the Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations.
8. If rendering is the method of choice for mortality disposal, the applicant shall provide an enclosed location for the pick up of dead animals before any animals are placed in the proposed barn.
9. That adequate measures be taken to minimize or control offensive odor, fumes, dust, noise, or vibrations so that none of these will constitute a nuisance.
10. That the proposed manure storage structure be designed by a registered engineer. A copy of the designed plans must be submitted to Blue Earth County Environmental Services prior to the issuance of a construction permit.
11. That the applicant will furnish a final construction report to Environmental Services verifying that the concrete manure storage structure was constructed per approved engineered design plan. Said construction report shall be signed by a professional engineer registered in the State of Minnesota and will include the following: photographic documentation of reinforcing steel placement, collection of three sample

concrete cylinders to be retained by the engineer / landowner for concrete compressive strength testing, and three batch tickets documenting the concrete design.

12. That the applicant comply with the storm-water control requirements established by the MPCA.
13. That if a shower, restroom or laundry facility is included with the proposed addition or any other livestock barns on the site, that a waste water treatment system is reviewed and constructed according to County Environmental Health Department standards.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and without publication.

**RESOLUTION GRANTING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO OPERATE A HOME CONSTRUCTION BUSINESS AS A LEVEL II HOME OCCUPATION LOCATED IN THE AGRICULTURAL AND CONSERVATION ZONED DISTRICTS IN THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 18, DECORIA TOWNSHIP**

**WHEREAS**, Jon and Jan Macklay (owner) and Brad Chambers (prospective buyer) of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

The South Two-Thirds (S 2/3) of the North One-Half (N1/2) of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (SW1/4 NW 1/4), of Section 18, Township 107, Range 26, EXCEPT the .47 acre tract described as follows: beginning at the southwest corner of said North One-Half (N1/2); thence Easterly along the south line of said South Two Thirds (2/3) 72.00 feet; thence deflecting left 77 degrees 30 minutes 00 seconds 190.00 feet; thence dg right 22 degrees 30 minutes 00 seconds 315.00 feet, more or less, to the north line of said South Two-Thirds (2/3); thence Westerly along said north line of said South Two-Thirds (2/3) to the West section line of said Section 13; thence Southerly along said West section line to the point of beginning, the point of ending. **WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC36-05), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission of the County on the 7th day of September, 2005, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds that:

1. That the proposed use conforms with the County Land Use Plan.
2. That the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
3. That the proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
4. That soil conditions are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
5. That the proposed use does not create a potential pollution hazard.
6. That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
7. That the Conditional Use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
8. That the establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for predominant uses in the area.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a home construction business in an accessory building as a Level II Home Occupation in an Agricultural Zoning District and Conservation District, is granted with the following conditions:

1. That construction business shall be conducted entirely within the accessory building and shall be carried on by the inhabitants of the home. Up to six employees are allowed other than the inhabitants of the home.

2. That the business shall be clearly incidental and secondary to the use of the property for residential purposes. Total maximum floor use area shall be 5,000 square feet.
3. That signage be limited to a 32-square foot non-illuminated sign on the property.
4. There shall be no indication of offensive noise, vibration, smoke, dust, odors, heat or glare beyond the property line.
5. That the operation of the home occupation shall begin no earlier than 8:00 a.m. and end no later than 5:00 p.m.
6. Materials and equipment shall be stored in an enclosed building or screened area.
7. If the business requires the use of a commercial truck, tractor, van, pickup or any vehicle whatsoever required to be registered as Y type vehicle or any trailer or other machinery capable of being trailed behind, such vehicle shall be parked off-street and upon the lot of the owner from where such home occupation is conducted. Parking is allowed only on a hard surfaced or gravel parking area. All drives accessing a hard-surfaced road shall be bituminous or concrete.
8. Any change in operation or use of the home occupation shall require review of the Conditional Use Permit. The applicant shall apply for a review of the Conditional Use Permit prior to any operational or construction changes involved with the proposed use.
9. Prior to start-up of operations, a list of all hazardous materials along with a floor plan showing the location of these materials must be submitted to the Good Thunder Fire Chief. Said information shall be resubmitted as needed.
10. Prior to obtaining a construction permit for the home and accessory building, the applicant shall submit a septic system design plan to the County Environmental Health Department.
11. That all exposed soil surfaces, stockpiles and other construction areas shall be properly protected from erosion until a permanent vegetative cover can be maintained.
12. Violations of any of the above conditions may lead to a review of the Conditional Use Permit by the Planning Commission and County Board of Commissioners.
13. The Conditional Use Permit shall be effective for a period of five years following County Board approval, until September 26, 2010. The applicant shall make application for review of the permit prior to August 1, 2010.

**RESOLUTION GRANTING A  
CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO CONTINUE TO  
OPERATE A FARM WINERY  
AS A LEVEL II HOME OCCUPATION  
SECTION 29, CAMBRIA TOWNSHIP**

**WHEREAS**, George and Paula Marti, owners of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth, Minnesota, to wit:

That part of the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 29 and the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 30, Cambria Township, Township 109 North, Range 29 West of the Fifth Principal Meridian, Blue Earth County Minnesota, described as follows:

Commencing at the northwest corner of said Section 29; thence on an assumed bearing of North 90 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds East, along the north line of said Section 29, a distance of 531 feet to the point of beginning of the tract to be described; thence South 90 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds West, along said north line of Section 29, a distance of 531.00 feet to the northwest corner of said Section 29; thence South 90 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds West, along the north line of said Section 30, a distance of 12.72 feet; thence South 4 degrees 11 minutes 58 seconds West a distance of 369.44 feet; thence South 0 degrees 59 minutes 59 seconds West a distance of 206.06 feet; thence South 9 degrees 57 minutes 19 seconds East a distance of 319 feet, more or less to shoreline of Morgan Creek; thence northeasterly, along said shoreline, a distance of 691 feet, more or less, to the intersection of a line bearing South 0 degrees 12 minutes 17 seconds West from the point of beginning; thence North 0 degrees 12 minutes 17 seconds East, a distance of 497 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning, containing 10.0 acres, more or less, subject to easements now of record in said county and state. ;

have applied to have their Conditional Use Permit to operate a Farm Winery as a Level II Home Occupation in an Agricultural Zoning District reviewed and their on-site parking plan revised; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 37-05 ), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission of the County on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September 2005, following proper notice, held a public hearing regarding the request and, following the hearing, adopted a recommendation that the request for a Conditional Use Permit be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. The Morgan Creek Vineyards was legally established in 1998 as a Level Two II Home Occupation that is clearly secondary to an owner occupied dwelling.
2. Morgan Creek Vineyards is located in a Shoreland District which is an environmentally sensitive area.
3. Conditions placed on the Morgan Creek Vineyards 1998 and the 2003 Conditional Use Permits related to protection of the public health and safety.
4. Changes and evolution in the Morgan Creek Vineyards operations necessitate a review of the Conditional Use Permit.
5. A vineyard is considered an agricultural use that is important in Blue Earth County.
6. Limited, special events directly related to the vineyard and winery are anticipated as accessory uses to successful operations.
7. Public and semi-public events at Morgan Creek Vineyards create special concerns related to safety and off road parking that require special conditions.
8. Due to site constrictions at Morgan Creek Vineyards, it is necessary to limit special events considered accessory to the vineyard as an agricultural use.
9. Operation of kitchen facilities and food service are difficult to handle in areas without municipal wastewater treatment facilities.
10. Special conditions relating to protection and maintenance of the onsite sewage treatments system are necessary for protecting public health.
11. State and local health and safety codes are applicable to Morgan Creek Vineyards.
12. Customers of Morgan Creek Vineyards spend time touring, tasting and consuming wine on the site.
13. The proposed parking plan for overflow parking will provide sufficient overflow parking and will be in a more convenient location for winery visitors than the overflow parking which was proposed in 2003.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Farm Winery as a Level II Home Occupation in an Agricultural Zoning District, is granted with the following conditions which replace the conditions on report PC 10-98 and PC 23-03:

1. That the access driveway for the overflow parking area must be constructed prior to the end of the 2005 construction season.
2. That the sign identifying the overflow parking area and the signs identifying each parking stall be installed prior to the end of the 2005 construction season.
3. That silt fences be installed prior to the construction of the access driveway for the overflow parking area to prevent any erosion from entering Morgan Creek.
4. The main parking surface and all access drives shall be maintained with a dust free, all weather surface.
5. The applicant must construct and maintain all wine processing areas consistent with accepted sanitary practices and procedures to protect public health.
6. The Level II Home Occupation must not have more than 6 employees other than the applicants.
7. The vegetation within 100 feet of Morgan Creek must be left in its natural condition.
8. That the hours of operation for the winery shall begin no earlier than 8:00 AM and end no later than 11:00 PM Friday through Sunday.
9. That the applicants must comply with all permits/licenses from the Minnesota Department of Health and Department of Agriculture for the operation of the wood fired oven and kitchen facilities and operate the facility in conformance with those licenses.
10. That seating in the winery and in the portico be limited to a capacity of thirty-six.
11. That only disposable utensils and plates be utilized for the food service.
12. That the food service portion of the Level II Home Occupation be limited to Friday through Sunday between the months of May and December.
13. That the food provided at the winery must be accessory to the winery operation and food prepared on site must only include food baked in the wood fired oven or food prepared off-site.

14. That the applicants submit water usage reports annually to Environmental Services for the weekend of an event and for a typical weekend during the summer.
15. That the operation of the wood fired oven must be in compliance with the provisions of the State Fire Code.
16. Violations of any of the above conditions may lead to a review of the Conditional Use Permit by the Planning Commission and County Board of Commissioners.
17. The owners of Morgan Creek Vineyards must report all operational changes related to these conditions to the County for review.

**WHEREAS**, Marie Farley, owner of the following real estate in the County of Blue Earth to wit:

Tract "A", Registered Land Survey # 129,

has requested a Conditional Use Permit to grade and place fill in a shore impact zone in the Rural Residence and Shoreland Zoned Districts on Lake Madison, a Recreational Development Lake; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Agency of the County has completed a review of the application and made a report pertaining to said request (PC 38-05), a copy of said report has been presented to the County Board; and,

**WHEREAS;** the request to grade and fill and place over ten yards of material in the Shoreland District does not conflict with the Land Use Plan. Grading and filling within the Shoreland District is a Conditional Use; and,

**WHEREAS;** the Planning Commission of the County on the 7<sup>th</sup> Day of September 2005, following proper notice held a public hearing regarding the request, and following due consideration of presented testimony and information, voted unanimously to forward the matter to the County Board with a recommendation for approval subject to conditions contained in staff report No. PC 38-05; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners finds:

1. The proposed use does not conflict with the County Land Use Plan.
2. The applicant has demonstrated a need for the proposed use.
3. If properly done the proposed use will not degrade the water quality of the County.
4. The proposed use will not adversely increase the quantity of water runoff.
5. The soils are adequate to accommodate the proposed use.
6. If properly done the proposed use should not create a potential pollution hazard.
7. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities have been or are being provided.
8. Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide sufficient off-road parking space to serve the proposed use.
9. If properly done the Conditional Use should not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted.
10. Establishment of the Conditional Use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding vacant property for the predominate uses in the area.

11. That site specific and such other conditions are established to protect the public's health, safety and general welfare.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Blue Earth County Board of Commissioners, that the request is hereby **granted** contingent upon the following:

1. All grading/filling and construction activities shall be conducted in accordance with approved plans attached to this staff report.
2. Erosion control measures must be employed to ensure that silt and solids are not carried from the site into the lake during construction activities. Said measures must be maintained until vegetation has been adequately established to protect the slope from the erosive forces of nature.
